Why weapons? (Teacher version)

This lesson helps pupils learn to understand the risks and consequences of carrying weapons. The lesson also seeks to raise awareness of risk situations and potential dangers that young people may face in their everyday lives whenever they are around weapons, to understand the law regarding weapons (especially knives and guns) in public places, on school premises and the police response and to consider what constitutes a legal and illegal weapon and the consequences of carrying such weapons.

This presentation helps pupils to:

- know what the law is about knives and bladed weapons
- challenge the myths behind why some young people may choose to carry a knife
- know how to stay safe when out and about
- know what to do if you know of someone who is carrying a knife
- choose to live knife free.



This presentation helps pupils to:

- understand that you have a right to be safe, on and offline.
- know how to show respect to others online
- know the laws around online harmful behaviour and offline violence
- understand the consequences of harmful online behaviour and choosing to behave violently offline
- know what to do if you experience or witness online harmful behaviour
- know the consequences of committing violent behaviour or inciting others to do this
- know who can help.

#NotTheOne is a new campaign developed by South Wales Police and the Wales Violence Prevention Unit.

The website includes resources teachers and school police officers can use to educate young people on the dangers and consequences of carrying a knife.



Helplines for children and young people

Childline

Childline is there for children and young people, online, on the phone, anytime. A child or young person can:

- Call free on 0800 1111 any day from 9am- midnight. This will not show on their phone bill.
- Chat online 1-2-1 with a counsellor any day from 9am- midnight by visiting childline.org.uk/get-support/1-2-1-counsellor-chat/
- Create an account to send an email to a Childline counsellor anytime by visiting childline.org.uk/get-support/

Fearless, Crimestoppers

Fearless is Crimestoppers youth service. Its website provides a safe place for young people to provide information about a crime completely anonymously. The website also provides a wealth of non-judgemental information and advice about crime and criminality.

Young people can give information about crime anonymously or access information by visiting fearless.org

Meic

Meic offers free, confidential, anonymous information, advice and advocacy helpline for children and young people. A child or young person can:

- Call free on 080880 23456 any day from 8am- midnight. This will not show on their phone bill.
- Chat online 1-2-1 with a member of the team 8am- midnight by visiting meiccymru.org/get-help/
- Text 84001 anytime. This is free and won't show up on their phone bill.
